Secretary Rubio, Acting Attorney General Blanche, and Secretary Bessent:

We write with grave concern about the brazen interference of senior U.S. officials, including President Trump, in Colombia's presidential election. This interference involves the full-throated endorsement of Abelardo de la Espriella, a candidate with a profoundly troubling record that appears to run counter to U.S. interests and potentially to U.S. laws.¹ Rather than campaigning for him, our government should be examining his ties to a terrorist-designated organization and an accused money launderer, and possible financial improprieties related to Florida-based companies and real estate transactions.

President Trump and multiple Republican Members of Congress have openly endorsed Mr. De la Espriella.² President Trump has also implied that if Mr. De la Espriella loses, Colombia may lose the support of the United States, its most important trade and security partner.³ This direct interference by U.S. officials in another country's democratic elections is inconsistent with longstanding principles of national sovereignty and non-interference, as well as international law.

This interference is particularly alarming given Mr. De la Espriella's background. A criminal defense lawyer and businessman, he has come under scrutiny over the source of his fortune and his links to Colombian clients, including Alex Saab, an ultra-wealthy fixer for Nicolás Maduro

who is currently under federal criminal indictment in the Southern District of Florida for allegedly laundering millions of dollars.⁴

Mr. De la Espriella has also maintained close relations with multiple leaders from the paramilitary drug-trafficking organization known as the United Self-Defense Forces of Colombia (AUC).⁵ The AUC, which the U.S. government designated as a foreign terrorist organization in 2001, was responsible for numerous massacres, assassinations and forced disappearances, as well as torture, forced displacement, sexual violence, collusion with state/security and political actors, and large-scale drug trafficking to the U.S. and other countries.⁶

Along with providing legal counsel to a variety of paramilitary leaders, Mr. De la Espriella has acted as an outspoken public advocate for their interests.⁷ He founded and led an organization that was reportedly financed by the AUC to broaden its social and political influence, campaigned to block the extradition of paramilitary leaders to the U.S. where they were facing drug-trafficking charges, and pressured the Colombian government and congress to push for pardons for AUC leaders in order to promote impunity for paramilitary crimes.⁸

He has also praised paramilitary leaders and opposed the implementation of the historic 2016 peace agreement, including institutions designed to provide a measure of justice for the thousands of innocent victims who were forcibly disappeared and killed by the Colombian military.⁹

There are also significant questions about the sources of Mr. De la Espriella's vast fortune. Several of his former clients have accused him of having pocketed funds allegedly intended to be



used for bribing key judicial actors, and some of his associates have been credibly implicated in wire fraud.¹⁰ Moreover, he and his spouse are connected to at least 14 Florida-based apparent shell companies and a number of multi-million-dollar Florida real estate purchases involving funds whose source is not clear.¹¹ There is evidence that at least one of these transactions may have been funded in part by Mr. Saab, who is currently under indictment for money laundering.¹²

It is possible that Mr. De la Espriella's U.S.-based assets were legally acquired, but his significant ties to Mr. Saab and paramilitary figures, suspicious transactions involving the possible flow of illicit funds into the U.S., and other credible allegations of criminal conduct warrant significant scrutiny and investigation by our government. We urge you to review these matters within your respective jurisdictions, investigate the sources of the funds used to finance Mr. De la Espriella's investments in the United States, and call on President Trump to stop interfering in another country's democratic election on behalf of an individual who may pose a threat to U.S. interests. Our government must respect, not undermine, the democracy and sovereignty of our neighbors in the region.
